Age: 3-6 years


Cost: Free if you borrow the book from the library and use supplies from around the house. (About \$10 to purchase a paperback copy of the book.)

Optional Supplies

- Book, [Sneezy the Snowman](#) by Maureen Wright, Illustrated by Stephen Gilpin
- A mug of hot chocolate

- Buttons, googly eyes, craft foam, a few small sticks for snowman arms
- A freezable container
- Child-safe scissors



How to Play

Once you have read the book together, make a mug of warm hot chocolate for each of you, and get to work making your own "Freezy the Snowman" out of craft foam, sticks, googly eyes, and buttons. Place your snowman into a container, fill with water, and put him in the freezer. In a few hours, check your "Freezy" to see what happened.
